Introduction

This project document outlines the plan to establish and operate the **Christ Passover Food Bank (CPfb)** to meet future crises or global famine while mitigating the present food situation in communities. The project aims to address the issue of food insecurity and hunger, which could become more acute due to climate change, natural disasters, and other factors. The food bank project will serve as a **strategic reserve of food** that can be distributed in emergencies to vulnerable populations around the world, **Nation by Nation and District by District**, according to the funds availability.

Project Background

Considering these two sources of documented information: The words of Jesus Christ; and the statistical observation of the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization, we all have to agree and put resources together to produce food for storage to mitigate any possible food crisis that might occur in unknown times:

- a. Christ Jesus said in Luke 21:9-11, 25 that:
 - Vs. 9: "... when ye shall hear of wars and commotions, be not terrified: for these things must first come to pass; but the end is not by and by."
 - Vs. 10: "Nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom."
 - **Vs. 11**: "And great earthquakes shall be in diverse places, and **famines**, and pestilences; and fearful sights and great signs shall there be from heaven."
 - Vs. 25: "And there shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars; and upon the earth distress of nations, with perplexity; the sea and the waves roaring."

These words of Christ Jesus are fulfilling right before our eyes in this generation.

b. According to the United Nations, the number of people suffering from hunger increased by 118 million in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and other factors. Climate change, conflict, and economic instability are also contributing to the problem of food insecurity. In addition, the Food and Agriculture Organization warns that global food production may decline by up to 2% per decade due to climate change.

our Vision - Urgent Initiative for Food Security

The Christ Passover Food Bank is "FOOD AVAILABLE TO THE HUNGRY DURING FAMINE" - an urgent initiative established to produce and store food on a larger scale to ensure food security for businesses, families, and communities in times of crisis.

Project Objectives - Why This Matters

With rising food costs, climate change, and economic uncertainties, food availability is a growing concern worldwide. The Christ Passover Food Bank is designed to:

- Produce and store food in advance to prevent shortages.
- Ensure food is available for individuals, families, and businesses in times of crisis.
- Establish food storage facilities in communities, Churches, Schools, Hospitals. Thereby ensuring Food Accessibility for All during the food crisis.

Starting from Ghana, we have chosen West Africa as the key region for large-scale food production. The food produced will be transported and stored in different communities and nations, ensuring food availability where and when it is needed.

Land Availability And Type of Food

Agricultural land is available for this project in Ghana, specifically in the Eastern Region, Ashanti Region, and Northern Region. These regions have been strategically selected for large-scale food production.

Currently, we have 800 hectares of farmland available at Afram place of Ghana for Maize and Yam Production, 200 hectare at Jiraapa at Upper West Region for Maize, Soybeans and Millet Production, 90 hectares at Agogo in the Ashanti Region for maize, beans and cassava production. 5 hectares at Akim Sekyere in Eastern Region for Large Scale Fish Farming. 450 hectares in Dormaa East for Cassava, Plantain, Maize Production.

The Christ Passover Food Bank (CPfb) shall focus on food grains, processing perishable foods into powder and dry food for storage etc

Our 7-Year Food Storage Goal

We have set a seven-year plan to:

- Expand food production to build long-term food reserves.
- Establish food storage facilities in various regions.

✔ Develop a transport and distribution system to make food accessible in times of need.

(The 7 years food storage goal is about reach the food bank capacity where we can feed registered members for a period of 365 days, during a period food crisis)

With active support from corporate entities, individual donors, working with investors and government agencies, we can build a sustainable food reserve that benefits everyone.

Food Storage Centers

The Christ Passover Food Bank aims to establish food storage centers in communities, Schools, Churches, Hospitals etc, globally. We shall produce food, transport it, and distribute it to individual storage centers, ensuring food accessibility for all.

Sustainability Plan

To ensure sustainability, food will be produced and stored at designated food storage centers. At the end of each year, a portion of the harvested food will be sold to raise capital for the following year's production. This cycle will sustain the project and expand food security efforts.

Food Preservation Plan

The Christ Passover Food Bank prioritizes quality control to prevent food spoilage. To extend shelf life:

- Some food products will be processed into other forms.
- We will use hermetic storage bags to avoid chemical preservatives.
- When selling harvested food to raise funds, we will replenish stocks with fresh harvests while selling older inventory to ensure long-term food storage.

2025 - 2026 Future Outlook: Fundraising for Christ Passover Food Bank through public mobilization of Donations, through Mission Partnership, appointing more project ambassadors to expand the project to other Communities, Starting the phase one of Christ Passover Food Bank Large Scale Food Production, connecting churches, schools, hospitals, vulnerable groups and other corporate entities of common mission with the Christ Passover Food Bank.
